



SANCTIONS PROCEDURES

Observe problem behaviour

No **Yes**

Is behaviour executive managed?

Classroom Management

Write the yellow card and discuss with AP for further action

Use 3 warnings system (refer to expectations)

Time out in classroom to reflect on problem behaviour (time at time out table is equal to the child's age)

Another incident and a yellow card issued (½ hour lunch) detention

2 yellow cards in a term and parents are contacted by teacher

3 yellow cards in a term and AP contacts parents to arrange a meeting to discuss an action plan to improve

Further yellow cards in a term and Principal contacts parents to discuss behaviour

Yellow card	Red card which leads to grey card or suspension
Wielding dangerous objects in the playground	Violence towards another member of the school or fighting
Disrespectful or rude behaviour	Long term bullying of other students
Deliberate disobedience after a prior warning	Serious wilful harm to others or damage to school property
Swearing in the playground or classroom	Inappropriate use of the internet
Misbehaviour during assemblies	Inappropriate use of mobile phones
Destroying school property	Truancy
Bullying	Insolence towards teachers or other staff or visitors
Isolated incidents of aggressive behaviour towards another student	Endangering the lives of self or others.
	Swearing with the purpose to offend
	Derogatory racial statements to staff, visitors or students
	Repeated occurrence of behaviours resulting in yellow cards

AP decides if the behaviour needs a 2 or 3 days half lunch time detention (red card)

Principal decides if behaviour needs a grey card (full lunch time detention/s in office) or suspensio

Executive follows through with consequence or behaviour modification plan

Executive provides feedback to teacher

Classroom Managed
Lack of preparedness, calling out, disruptive behaviour, put downs, refusing to work, inappropriate attitude, inappropriate comments, food or drink, mobile phones, disrespecting equipment.

Playground Time Out and record in playground folder
Being out of bounds, continual breach of school 'no hat, no play' rule, littering, interfering in other students' games minor playground misdemeanours.

Suspension
In accordance with DET procedures, the Principal may suspend or expel a student if problem behaviour has not been rectified or has escalated, or if the student is violent or threatens violence.
